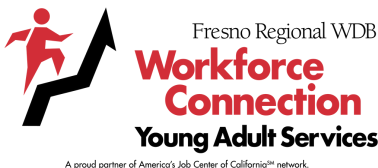

- Resident of Fresno County
- Age 16 - 21
- Enrolled & attending school
- Must have an IEP or 504 Plan
- Right to work in the U.S.
